### 10 facilities

#### Owns 10 historic facilities

The old National Stadium was the main venue for the Tokyo 1964 Olympics, while the new Stadium hosted the 2020 Olympics and Paralympics. Other facilities operated by the JSC include a rugby stadium, football stadium, boat house, and the High Performance Sport Center (HPSC).



### 109 medals

#### Contributed to the record acquisition of 109 medals at Tokyo 2020 Game

To improve Japan's international competitiveness in Olympic and Paralympic sports, the JSC subsidizes athlete enhancement programs, conducts research and support in the fields of sport science, medicine, and information, and provides training environments.



### 95% subscription

#### About 95% of Japan's schoolchildren are covered by the program

Providing benefits for medical expenses for injuries or accidents occurring while the child is under school supervision, we contribute to the smooth implementation of school education.



### 202.9 billion yen

#### Supports sport to the tune of about 1.8 billion dollars

Through revenue from the sale of sport promotion lottery tickets, we have subsidized, among others, the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the 2019 Rugby World Cup, international sport events and world championships, the discovery and training of future elite athletes, and the construction of regional sport facilities.



### 31 networks

#### Collaborates with more than 31 organizations worldwide

The JSC has formed networks with sport organizations in such countries as the United Kingdom, Australia, the Netherlands, and France, as well as countries and regions in Asia, and participates in mutual cooperation and activities toward the development of sport.



### 884 networks

#### Collaborates with 884 local authorities in Japan

The Japan Sport Network operates a regional sports policy platform to promote local sport policy and participation.
