31 networks

The JSC collaborates with more than 31 organizations around the world. We have formed networks with governmental sporting bodies in such countries as the United Kingdom, Australia, the Netherlands, and France, as well as in Asia.

In collaboration with the Nederlands Olympisch Comité*Nederlandse Sport Federatie and local governments in Japan, the JSC engages in projects to, among other things, disseminate and develop para-sports. The JSC led Association of Sports Institutes in Asia (ASIA) conducts activities to develop sport throughout Asia.



The JSC contributed to the acquisition of a record 109 medals at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics and Paralympics. To improve Japan's international competitiveness, the JSC subsidizes athlete enhancement programs, conducts research in the fields of sport medicine, science, and information, and provides training environments.

Japan won 58 medals at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, the highest ever, and 51 at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics, the second highest ever. The result of the support for winter sports can be seen in Japan's top-class performance at the Beijing 2022 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games.

1964

The former National Stadium was the main venue for the Tokyo 1964 Olympic Games. The Yoyogi National Stadium, Prince Chichibu Memorial Rugby Stadium, and Toda Boat House continue to be cherished as a legacy of the 1964 Olympics.

2020

The Japan National Stadium was the main venue for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games. Reborn in 2019. it welcomed top athletes from around the world for the opening and closing ceremonies and track and field events. The Yoyogi National Stadium, the venue for handball, wheelchair rugby, and badminton, is designated as an important cultural property of the state.



JSC and local authorities have established the Japan Sport Network (JSN), an inter-regional collaboration network, to promote regional sports policy innovation.

JSN has grown into the largest sports policy network in Japan, with 50% of local authorities participating (884 organizations). It promotes local sport strategies and activities through the provision of manifold services that contribute to sport and regional development.







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Japan High Performance Sport Center (HPSC)

The HPSC provides support and a high-level scientific training environment through the expertise in sport science, medicine. and information possessed by the JISS and NTC. Viewing Olympic and Paralympic sports equally, the HPSC contributes toward the strengthening of high-performance sport both domestically and internationally.

Japan Institute of Sports Sciences (JISS)

Utilizing the latest equipment and materials, the JISS is a facility for conducting more effective sport medicine and science research and support. In projects commissioned by the Japan Sports Agency, it assists athletes by, for example, setting up support centers near the Olympic Village.





Ajinomoto National Training Center (NTC)



The NTC comprises dedicated practice space for each sport, common courts, and accommodation facilities. It enables top-level competitors to conduct intensive and continuous training at

Sport Policy & Information Activities



The JSC collects and analyzes both domestic and international information relating to sport policies and programs. We also propose policies to local governments and others.

International Strategic Activities



The JSC strategically builds overseas networks and links of information for sport policy and collaborative projects

Sport for Tomorrow (SFT)



JSC acted as the secretariat for SFT - an initiative by the Japanese government for and exchange projects, that has conveyed the value of sport to more than 13 million people in 204 countries and regions (2014–2021).

Maintaining and enhancing sport integrity

The JSC aims to ensure safety, fairness, and justice in sport. We conduct activities to fight against doping, protect elite athletes from violence and harassment, and strengthen governance and compliance in sport organizations.



202.9 billion yen

The JSC supports sport to the tune of about 1.8 billion dollars. Through revenue from the Japanese sport promotion lottery, we subsidized the Tokyo 2020 Olympics and Paralympics, the 2019 Rugby World Cup, and international sport events including world championships. We support the discovery and training of future elite athletes and the construction of sport facilities.

Up to and including fiscal 2020, the JSC has subsidized 190 international sport events and 28,960 projects in total.



About 95% of schoolchildren in Japan are members of the Injury and Accident Mutual Aid Benefit System. By, for example, providing benefits for medical expenses for injuries or accidents occurring while the child is under school supervision, we contribute to the smooth implementation of school education.



In fiscal 2020 there were 16.31 million subscribing members, and we paid benefits for medical expenses. disability compensation, and death compensation in about 1.49 million cases during the year. We also support efforts to prevent accidents by conducting research on accident data obtained from this system.

facilities

As well as sport facilities that host international competitions and other events, the JSC also operates the High Performance Sports Center, the National Center for Mountaineering Education, and the Prince Chichibu Memorial Sports Museum and Library.

Japan National Stadium

Yoyogi National Stadium (1st Gymnasium, 2nd Gymnasium)



With its beautiful suspended roof structure. the building is a representative work by the architect Kenzo Tange and has been designated as an important <u>cultural</u> property of the state.

Prince Chichibu Memorial Rugby Stadium



Once the venue for ootball events at the Tokyo 1964 Olympics, the stadium is now used for international and national rugby tournaments.

Ajinomoto Field Nishigaoka



This dedicated football stadium is widely used for international games. national university tournaments, and other match-

Toda Boat House



Built for rowing events at the Tokyo 1964 Olympics, today this facility is used for rowing training camps and practice.
